Note:

The Three-Character Classic was probably written in 13th century. It is commonly attributed as the work of Wang Yinglin of the Song Dynasty. The work comprises of traditional Chinese values and philosophy, especially the basis of Confucian morality.

The work is written in triplet of characters for easy memorization. It is also well-known as the early learning materials on Confucianism for young children.
